Lutheran Educator Poster Sessions

What is a poster session, you ask? It's an informal way to share your good idea with others in a fashion that's much less threatening than leading an entire session!

Here's how our poster sessions will work:

- We will have small cocktail-height tables set up in the hallways of our conference area.
- You may display your idea in whatever form works best for you: a "science fair board", a laptop with slides, or some other method.
- Poster sessions will be from 2:00-2:40 PM on Monday, between regular LEC sessions so you won't miss out on any workshops.
- You'll stand by your display and talk to folks who stop by, then give them some sort of handout or a link to resources. You won't be talking to a whole room full of people for an hour....just briefly to a few people at a time.

Easy breezy, right?

We're looking for poster sessions from all areas of ministry (lessons, technology use, projects, classroom management/organization, children's sermons, mission trips, VBS...you name it!) for all ages: early childhood, elementary, middle and high school, even young adult ministry. Too nervous to present by yourself? Buddy up with a colleague!

A few poster session tips:

- Plan your display to fit on a cocktail-size table (about a 3 foot round).
- Make your display eye-catching so folks will stop by.
- Plan to have some sort of handout or link so folks leave with an idea they can use when they return to their schools.
- Sorry...we can't provide power, so make sure your devices are powered up!
